Canadian Numbers

- 40,000 over a year
- 7000 on any given night
- 20% of ALL
 homeless are
 between 16-24
 years old






Characteristics of population

- 2/3 are male
- LGBTQ youth over-represented
- Some minority populations are over-represented (including Aboriginal youth)
- Age difference matters (under 16, 16-18, 19-25)

DIAGRAM 1 Causes of Youth Homelessness




Socio-economic shifts have changed the nature of adolescence and young adulthood.

- Rise in credentialism (important to stay in school longer)
- Full time jobs paying living wage are scarce (most young people can only get low paying part time work)
- Young people stay in the parental home much longer



Over 42% of young people aged 20-29



Live with their parents!





Youth homelessness must be understood as different from adult homelessness, both in terms of causes and the experience of life on the streets







OUTREACH: Working in Schools






Working with Families

- Connecting with resources
- Strengthening anger management and conflict resolution skills within families
- Foster parenting skills and healthy childhood development
- Ensure young people have access to early childhood education, adequate nutrition and enriched engagement (arts, sports)



A Collaborative Plan to Prevent and End Youth Homelessness

The overarching goals of the Youth Homelessness Plan are two-fold:

- Prevent youth from becoming homeless through family supports and education; and
- Rapid rehousing of homeless youth through family reunification or supportive living by utilizing a client-centred approach.

Policy Shifts

- From fragmented service delivery to a coordinated response to youth homelessness.
- From crisis management of youth homelessness to prevention and rapid rehousing.
- Improved data collection to inform scope and measure success.






Aboriginal Homelessness in Canada






Aboriginal Children and Youth in Care In Canada
